**Friends of James Hillman invite you to join us for an archetypal
event and celebration in honor of James Hillman
in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania,
from the evening of June 19, 2008, until noon on June 22.**

The intention of this gathering is to honor the lifetime achievement of Hillman's work and to acknowledge its seminal influence on many scholars worldwide, and to bring together many friends and colleagues who have carried on the spirit of archetypal psychology in their own original ways.

Thursday, June 19, 2008

6:00 to 7:00 p.m.: Meet friends and colleagues for the Cocktail Hour in the lobby bar of the Sheraton Hotel, followed by dinner on your own.
